LESSON 1

SALUDOS Y DESPEDIDAS

Let's begin with greetings and farewells!
The first words we usually share with others are to say hello and goodbye. In Spanish, greetings and farewells are part of everyday life and help you connect with people from the very first moment.

Let's explore how to greet in different situations whether with friends, family, or new people you meet and the most common ways to say goodbye.

LET'S START WITH GREETINGS!

In Spanish, there are formal and informal greetings:

Formal (for teachers, strangers, or serious situations)



Buenos días

Good morning



Buenas tardes

Good afternoon



Buenas noches

Good evening / Good night

Informal (for friends, family, classmates)



¡Hola!

Hi / Hello



¿Qué tal?

How's it going?



¿Cómo estás?

How are you?



AND NOW, FAREWELLS!

Just like greetings, farewells can be formal or informal:

Formal (for teachers, strangers, or serious situations)

Adiós
Goodbye

Hasta luego
See you later

Hasta mañana
See you tomorrow

Informal (for friends, family, classmates)

¡Chao!
Bye!

Nos vemos
See ya

¡Cuídate!
Take care

DIALOGUE 1

Carla: ¡Hola! ¿Cómo estás?
Hi! How are you?

Tomás: Bien, gracias. ¿Y tú?
Fine, thanks. And you?

Carla: Muy bien. ¿Qué haces por aquí?
Very well. What are you doing around here?

Tomás: Estoy esperando a unos amigos.
I'm waiting for some friends.

Carla: ¡Genial! Entonces nos vemos luego.
Great! Well, I'll see you later then.

Tomás: ¡Chao, cuídate!
Bye, take care



DIALOGUE 2

Luis: Buenos días, profesora.

Good morning, teacher.

Profesora: Buenos días, Luis. ¿Cómo estás hoy?

Good morning, Luis. How are you today?

Luis: Muy bien, gracias. ¿Y usted?

Very well, thank you. And you?

Profesora: Bien también, gracias. ¿Tienes clases después de esta?

I'm fine too, thank you. Do you have classes after this one?

Luis: Sí, tengo matemáticas en una hora.

Yes, I have math in an hour.

Profesora: ¡Qué bien! Entonces aprovecha el tiempo.

That's great! Then make good use of the time.

Luis: Claro que sí. Muchas gracias, profesora.

Of course. Thank you very much, teacher.
